

LIGHTING THE ADVENT CANDLE:

*CALL TO CONFESSION

Family of faith, one of the beautiful things about the prayer of confession is it is often a prayer we say together. There are times when we close our eyes, bow our heads, and exchange private words with our Creator. But there are other times when praying out loud as a community allows us to right our relationship with God and with one another as well. This is one of those moments. So as a community, please join me in our call and response prayer of confession. Join me in speaking the truth of our lives. Join me in practicing grace.

PRAYER OF CONFESSION & WORDS OF FORGIVENESS:
